SCRIPTURE LESSONS: OLD TESTAMENT LESSON – EZEKIEL 37:1-14

P: ^{37:1} [The Prophet Ezekiel said:] The hand of the Lord was upon me, and He brought me out in the Spirit of the Lord and set me down in the middle of the valley; it was full of bones. ² And He led me around among them, and behold, there were very many on the surface of the valley, and behold, they were very dry. ³ And He said to me, “Son of man, can these bones live?” And I answered, “O Lord God, You know.” ⁴ Then He said to me, “Prophesy over these bones, and say to them, ‘O dry bones, hear the Word of the Lord.’” ⁵ Thus says the Lord God to these bones: Behold, I will cause breath to enter you, and you shall live. ⁶ And I will lay sinews upon you, and will cause flesh to come upon you, and cover you with skin, and put breath in you, and you shall live, and you shall know that I am the Lord.”

⁷ So I prophesied as I was commanded. And as I prophesied, there was a sound, and behold, a rattling, and the bones came together, bone to its bone. ⁸ And I looked, and behold, there were sinews on them, and flesh had come upon them, and skin had covered them. But there was no breath in them. ⁹ Then He said to me, “Prophesy to the breath; prophesy, son of man, and say to the breath, ‘Thus says the Lord God: Come from the four winds, O breath, and breathe on these slain, that they may live.’” ¹⁰ So I prophesied as He commanded me, and the breath came into them, and they lived and stood on their feet, an exceedingly great army.

¹¹ Then He said to me, “Son of man, these bones are the whole house of Israel. Behold, they say, ‘Our bones are dried up, and our hope is lost; we are indeed cut off.’” ¹² Therefore prophesy, and say to them, “Thus says the Lord God: Behold, I will open your graves and raise you from your graves, O My people. And I will bring you into the land of Israel. ¹³ And you shall know that I am the Lord, when I open your graves, and raise you from your graves, O My people. ¹⁴ And I will put My Spirit within you, and you shall live, and I will place you in your own land. Then you shall know that I am the Lord; I have spoken, and I will do it,” declares the Lord.”

EPISTLE LESSON – 1 JOHN 5:4-10

P: ^{5,4} For everyone who has been born of God overcomes the world. And this is the victory that has overcome the world – our faith. ⁵ Who is it that overcomes the world except the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God?

⁶ This is He Who came by water and blood – Jesus Christ; not by the water only but by the water and the blood. And the Spirit is the One Who testifies, because the Spirit is the truth. ⁷ For there are three that testify: ⁸ The Spirit and the water and the blood; and these three agree. ⁹ If we receive the testimony of men, the testimony of God is greater, for this is the testimony of God that He has borne concerning His Son. ¹⁰ Whoever believes in the Son of God has the testimony in himself. Whoever does not believe God has made Him a liar, because he has not believed in the testimony that God has borne concerning His Son.

TRIPLE HALLELUJAH AND READING OF THE GOSPEL LESSON – JOHN 20:19-31

P: ^{20:19} On the evening of that day, the first day of the week, the doors being locked where the disciples were for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said to them, “Peace be with you.” ²⁰ When He had said this, He showed them His hands and His side. Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Lord. ²¹ Jesus said to them again, “Peace be with you. As the Father has sent Me, even so I am sending you.” ²² And when He had said this, He breathed on them and said to them, “Receive the Holy Spirit. ²³ If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you withhold forgiveness from any, it is withheld.”

²⁴ Now Thomas, one of the twelve, called the Twin, was not with them when Jesus came. ²⁵ So the other disciples told him, “We have seen the Lord.” But he said to them, “Unless I see in His hands the mark of the nails, and place my finger into the mark of the nails, and place my hand into His side, I will never believe.”

²⁶ Eight days later, His disciples were inside again, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, “Peace be with you.” ²⁷ Then He said to Thomas, “Put your finger here, and see My hands; and put out your hand, and place it in My side. Do not disbelieve, but believe”

²⁸ Thomas answered Him, “My Lord and my God!” ²⁹ Jesus said to him, “Have you believed because you have seen Me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed.”

³⁰ Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; ³¹ but these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in His Name.

APOSTLE’S CREED (CONFESSION OF FAITH) [PAGE 12]

HYMN OF THE DAY: ♪ 208

SERMON: YOU’RE TURNED FROM SIN AND SELF TO YOUR SAVIOR, LIFE AND SALVATION – JOHN 20:19-31

Jesus said: “Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed.” (Jn. 20:28-29)

Grace and peace to you from God your heavenly Father, and Jesus Christ, your risen Savior. Amen. Thomas, one of Jesus’ disciples, refuses to believe that He’s risen from the dead – even though Christ Himself said He’d rise from the dead; even though Thomas’ fellow disciples tell him in no uncertain terms that they’ve seen their risen Master! Like Judas with his betrayal of Jesus and Peter with his denial of Him, Thomas also proves unfaithful to the Son of God.

These three men who betray, deny and doubt Jesus all sin grievously against their Lord. Judas won’t follow, serve and worship Christ since He’s not acting like the type of savior Judas wants. He doesn’t care for the

Redeemer from sin, death, Satan and hell – One Who saves sinners out of this fallen world. Peter doesn't want to die with his Lord. So he completely denies Him to save his own hide. Two things about this: Jesus had already guaranteed the safety of His followers, and was seeing to their divine protection. Peter can't save himself the night of Jesus' arrest, or any time, really. It's only Jesus Who has done, and Who can do, the saving – of Peter, of us, of many!

Judas, tragically, never repents of his betrayal of Jesus – his unbelief and rejection of Him as the Messiah. He has the same opportunity that Peter and Thomas do to be turned back from rejecting the Son of God. Yet Judas says no to this forever. Praise God that His Spirit moves Peter to heartfelt repentance so that Jesus forgives him three times for three denials! And that Jesus comes again to Thomas to take away His unbelief and denial of His resurrection.

Whose treachery is the worst: the betrayer's, the denier's or the unbeliever's? If we run this question by the Holy Law of God, each treacherous act equally condemns these men as sinners deserving death and eternal separation from God. Each one is guilty of sinning against Him. Each one places his faith somewhere other than in the Savior. They're all without hope unless Jesus calls them to repentance and to saving faith in the Name of their Holy God.

How do we stack up next to these three men, and really, the rest of the disciples, who all flee from their Lord at His arrest – abandoning Him? We, too, are total sinners in total need of the Savior from sin: Jesus! Like the twelve disciples, we're turned in on ourselves, paying homage to self over Savior. The heart of sin is us! The "I" in the middle of the word "sin" describes our terrible condition – that our hearts are centered on us! We're curved in on ourselves. We have an irrepressible egotism, putting ourselves before-and-above-God. We want to bury this ugly truth about us deep down so that God won't see it. God always sees and knows it! We can't justly claim to be different or better than Judas, Peter and Thomas. We share in their sinful nature as if we kissed Jesus in betrayal; as if we denied Him thrice; as if we doubted His resurrection.

The three men's greatest offense against almighty God is cutting themselves off from the proper worship of Him by their sinful wills and actions. Proper Divine Worship is the frequent, faithful reception of God's grace. The Lord Jesus desires to keep all three men well-fed and nourished in their faith in Him throughout, but the betrayer betrays his Lord in cold-heartedness and unbelief, and loses his life and soul for it. Peter robs himself of Jesus' presence and comfort in denying Him. Thomas doesn't believe the message of the resurrected Jesus for a whole week.

So no, there's no devout Divine Worship going on for the three when they're pretty much just worshiping themselves and their own cares. That's what gets in the way of our holy worship of God as well. Being curved in on ourselves, we more easily turn to our own selves and our own things than to God Himself and His holy things, His holy blessings: His living Word and His precious body and blood given and shed for dying sinners.

So God calls us to repentance – to be turned by His merciful, loving hand from sin and self to our Savior! It's as if He says to us: "Repent, O Christian! Believe the Gospel, since by My Son's death and resurrection I blot out all your transgressions, I forgive your iniquities, and I remember your sins no more!" (*See Is. 43:25; Heb. 8:12*)

Beware of being like Judas, so that your faith withers and dies because Jesus just isn't the kind of Lord and Savior you want Him to be. Instead, be like penitent Peter who weeps bitterly about his betrayal of Jesus in true contrition. Peter doesn't abandon his Lord. He heeds the Spirit's call to repentance and is restored to saving faith in Jesus.

Be like Thomas, who returned to the Lord Jesus to receive the forgiveness of his sins, the rooting out of his unbelief and a stout faith in God.

Both Peter and Thomas worship Jesus anew, gladdened by His mercy in taking away the judgment and suffering they deserved for their denial and unbelief, and overjoyed by His richly providing them forgiveness, life and salvation.

We were there with Judas betraying Jesus, Peter denying Him, and with Thomas refusing Jesus' resurrection. But God, in His grace and mercy, has rescued and redeemed us from being betrayers, deniers and refusers of the risen Jesus.

So these three men showed, and we also show, what real sin is in our lives; what being a poor, miserable sinner looks like. Yet God, for the sake of His Son, Jesus Christ – the betrayed, denied and rejected One – God has had mercy on us all! (*See Rom. 11:32*) He's laid all the disciples' betrayal, denial and unbelief and rejection of His beloved

Son – and all our sin also – on Christ Himself on the cross! Together with St. Peter, you’re absolved of all of your sins, pardoned of your iniquities, three times over and countless times besides! Christ Jesus died for more sins than you have!

Together with St. Thomas, you see the risen Christ in His proclaimed Word to you, and in the real presence of His body and blood given for you to eat and drink of – so that Christ goes into you and fills you with His resurrection and eternal life! Jesus’ resurrection means everything to St. Peter, St. Thomas and to you! In His resurrection, you’re raised to life, too! You’re raised from sin, unbelief and death – from turning on God – to being dear friends of Jesus, His brothers and sisters, believers in Him, and faithful witnesses and confessors of His holy, precious Name.

All glory and honor be to God and the Lamb! Since you’ve been resurrected to faith and new life in Jesus, you’ll certainly be raised from your grave at Jesus’ glorious return. You’re alive in Christ inside His beloved, holy Church! How much more will this be so in His heavenly Church-to-come!

That’s the beauty of God’s Divine Service for you! Curved in on ourselves though we are, we can still enter into God’s holy House and presence and not be destroyed as we deserve. Instead, we’re covered with the holiness of Christ so that we may joyfully receive saving gift after saving gift from *Invocation* to *Benediction* – beginning to end! Clothed with Christ in Holy Baptism, covered by His grace and mercy, pronounced forgiven and free of all guilt in His Holy Absolution, fed by Jesus and with Jesus, God looks upon us as His beloved children – just like He looks at and loves His Son Jesus! Our sin, our betrayal, denial and disbelief are covered up and removed from us by Christ’s righteousness. So when our heavenly Father looks upon us, He only sees Jesus, His righteousness, and His great love for us! Jesus is with us. He’s all we need for life and eternity! St. Peter and St. Thomas believed, confessed and loved this truth, and so do you! Amen. *The peace of God, which passes all understanding, keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus. Amen.*
