SUMMARY OF TODAY'S SCRIPTURE READINGS – SEVENTH SUNDAY OF EASTER/ASCENSION OF OUR LORD

Jesus Is Ascended, but Not Absent On the fortieth day after His resurrection, our Lord ascended to the right hand of the Father. But although Jesus is hidden from our eyes, He is not absent from us. For He now fills all things in heaven and on earth. He continues "to do and to teach," (Acts 1:1) preaching repentance and forgiveness of sins through those sent in His Name (Lake 24:44-53), giving us His true body and blood in His Holy Supper. Jesus is your great Elijah Who pours out on you a double portion of His Spirit in the Word and the Sacraments. (2 Kings 2:5-15) He is Lord over all things for the sake of the Church. He Whom heaven cannot contain has raised your human nature to share fully in the glory of God. You who believe and are baptized into Christ's body, the Church, are already sitting in the heavenly places; for you are in Him Who is at the Father's right hand. When He comes again in the clouds on the Last Day, you also will appear with Him in glory. (lcms.org/lectionary-summaries)

A READING FROM THE LUTHERAN CONFESSIONS

Summary: Jesus' Ascension to "the right hand of God" was not about leaving His people behind. It was about departing from sight to fill the whole world while remaining hidden in it amidst His holy Christian Church. There He rules over His people as His Holy Spirit works amongst baptized believers to keep them with Him through His Word and Sacraments.

Our Churches teach that the Word, that is, the Son of God (ref. John 1:14), assumed the human nature in the womb of the blessed virgin Mary. So there are two natures – the divine and the human – inseparably joined in one person. There is one Christ, true God and true man, Who was born of the virgin Mary, truly suffered, was crucified, died, and was buried. He did this to reconcile the Father to us and to be a sacrifice, not only for original guilt, but also for all actual sins of mankind. (Ref. John 1:29) He also descended into hell, and truly rose again on the third day. Afterward, He ascended into heaven to sit at the right hand of the Father. There He forever reigns and has dominion over all creatures. He sanctifies those who believe in Him, by sending the Holy Spirit into their hearts to rule, comfort, and make them alive. He defends them against the devil and the power of sin. The same Christ will openly come again to judge the living and the dead, and so forth, according to the Apostles' Creed. (Augsburg Confession, Article 3; The Son of God)

SCRIPTURE LESSONS: FIRST LESSON – 2 KINGS 2:5-15

P: ⁵The sons of the prophets who were at Jericho drew near to Elisha and said to him, "Do you know that today the Lord will take away your master from over you?" And he answered, "Yes, I know it; keep quiet."

⁶Then Elijah said to Elisha, "Please stay here, for the Lord has sent me to the Jordan." But he said, "As the Lord lives, and as you yourself live, I will not leave you." So the two of them went on. ⁷Fifty men of the sons of the prophets also went and stood at some distance from them, as they both were standing by the Jordan. ⁸Then Elijah took his cloak and rolled it up and struck the water, and the water was parted to the one side and to the other, till the two of them could go over on dry ground.

And when he had struck the water, the water was parted to the one side and to the other, and Elisha went over.

¹⁵Now when the sons of the prophets who were at Jericho saw him opposite them, they said, "The spirit of Elijah rests on Elisha." And they came to meet him and bowed to the ground before him.

SECOND LESSON – ACTS 1:1-11

P: [St. Luke the Evangelist writes:] ¹ In the first book [St. Luke's Gospel account], O Theophilus, I have dealt with all that Jesus began to do and teach, ² until the day when He was taken up, after He had given commands through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom He had chosen. ³He presented Himself alive to them after His suffering by many proofs, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the Kingdom of God.

⁴ And while staying with them He ordered them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for the promise of the Father, which, He said, "you heard from Me; ⁵ for John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now."

⁶So when they had come together, they asked Him, "Lord, will You at this time restore the Kingdom to Israel?" ⁷He said to them, "It is not for you to know times or seasons that the Father has fixed by His own authority. ⁸But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be My witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth." ⁹And when He had said these things, as they were looking on, He was lifted up, and a cloud took Him out of their sight. ¹⁰And while they were gazing into heaven as He went, behold, two men stood by them in white robes, ¹¹and said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking into heaven? This Jesus, Who was taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw Him go into heaven."

SERMON: GOD THE SON HAS GONE UP TO ABIDE WITH YOU AND BLESS YOU FOREVER – LUKE 24:44-53

"While [Jesus] blessed [His followers,] He parted from them and was carried up into heaven." (Lk. 24:51) Amen.

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and our Savior Jesus Christ, Who's risen and ascended; Who'll "come in the same way as [His apostles] saw Him go into heaven." (Acts 1:11) Amen. Forty days following His resurrection from the dead, Christ Jesus ascended into heaven. Since He's our almighty, eternal God, and also the Lord of life, His tomb couldn't possibly hold Him for very long. (See Acts 2:24) Neither will ours be able to hold us, ultimately. And since it wasn't His Father's will for our Lord to remain on this earth always, but to ascend to Him on high after vanquishing sin and death, Satan and all evil for us, this earth couldn't contain Christ on-and-on. As we sing: "From the Father forth He came and returneth to the same, captive leading death and hell – high the song of triumph swell!" (TLH 95:4)

Just as Jesus had foretold His death and resurrection beforehand, so did our Lord also foretell His ascension, saying, "I came from the Father and entered the world. In turn, I will leave the world and go to the Father." (Jn. 16:28) The Psalmist before Him also prophesied: "God has gone up with a shout, the Lord with the sound of a trumpet." (Ps. 47:5)

Christ the Lord rose for you in glory to the right hand of His heavenly Father – to the position of all "blessing and honor and glory and might forever and ever." (Rev. 5:13) He ascended "far above the heavens, that He might fill all things." (Eph. 4:10) Our forefather-in-the-faith, Rev. Luther, explains Jesus filling all things to mean that He's now glorified in His body according to His divine nature, and so is able to be bodily-present everywhere He wishes according to His deity.

This glorious truth makes all the difference in the world! Your Redeemer departed this world "not to leave you as orphans" but to "come to you." (Jn. 14:18) How good of Him to ascend to heaven in order to be more present with you, and for you, than ever! He comes to you and is present in your very midst as your Immanuel, God-with-you (see Mt. 1:23) in His blessed Word. Speaking of you and of all His faithful, dear Christians; His holy Church here on earth, your Savior says, "For where two or three are gathered in My Name, there I am among them." (Mt. 18:20) This is the very definition of the Church of the living God: Saints of God gathered around our precious Savior, abiding in Him in Word and Sacrament. Rev. C.F.W. Walther, first President of our Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod, wrote: "The Church…is the congregation of saints, that is, the entirety of all those who, called out of the lost and condemned human race by the Holy Spirit through the Word, truly believe in Christ and by faith are sanctified and incorporated in Christ." (Thesis I on the Church)

That the Lord Jesus is truly present with us in His Word and Sacraments is evident as well in His closing words to His disciples and to us in the Gospel of Matthew. In His Great Commission to His Church, Christ declares: "Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, even to the end of the age." (Mt. 28:19-20) Did you hear it? Your beloved Jesus is with you always, here – to the very end of your lives; of the world. Yes, He's present with you in the proclamation of His precious Word – which always makes you clean in Christ. (See Jn. 15:3) He's with you, for you in His Baptismal grace, daily washing away your unbelief, sin and death from you with Baptismal waters as with His precious, shed blood.

Our Lord is also able to be present, and is truly present for your life-long and eternal well-being in His own body and blood upon His holy altar. We believe and confess, according to our Lutheran Confession in the Epitome of the Formula of Concord: "[Christ gives] His true body and blood in the Holy Supper, as One Who is present – and it is very easy for Him to do so. He does not do this according to the mode or ability of the human nature, but according to the mode or ability of God's right hand," (Article 8: The Person of Christ, 17) that is, His divine nature. So when He speaks over bread and wine, "This is My body; this is My blood," (Mt. 26:26-28) Jesus Christ, according to His divinity, causes to be present His saving, enlivening body and blood under the elements.

So you bet your Jesus is with you when you eat and drink of His body and blood by faith in His saving Name! For in His Supper Christ goes into you, so that you can say as you return from His altar, "My Jesus is with me, in me, since I've partaken of His true body and blood for my life and salvation!"

Not only did our Savior Jesus have to ascend into heaven for us all; not only is He ever-present with us and for us in the Word of His Truth and in His body and blood, He also ascended in victory for us! Christ's ascension is His taking His death-and-resurrection triumph into heaven, since on the cross and from the empty tomb He has conquered and vanquish all our enemies for us, including sin, death, the devil and all the forces of hell. This is evident in St. Paul's words to the Ephesian Church: "When He ascended on high, He led a host of captives away, and gave gifts to men." (Eph. 4:8) The Apostle is referencing a practice in the ancient world where a king, victorious in battle, would lead his army in a triumphant procession – with their conquered enemy being dragged along as captives at

the rear. Not only did this demonstrate the king's glory in his conquest, it also deeply humiliated and devastated his captive foes.

So see all your sins, which would condemn you; see death, which stalks you, Satan, who accuses you, temptation and every evil, which wish to swallow you whole in all their vile abominations – see them all as they really are: led captive for you in utter defeat and degradation behind the ascending Christ, Who's triumphant over them all!

Praise God, since His own dear Son "suffered, died and was buried, that He might make satisfaction for [us] and pay what [we] owe, not with silver nor gold, but with His own precious blood. And all this [He did,] in order to become [our] Lord; for He did none of these for Himself, nor had He any need of it. And after that He rose again from the dead, swallowed up and devoured death, and finally ascended into heaven and assumed the government at the Father's right hand, so that the devil and all powers must be subject to Him and lie at His feet, until finally, at the last day, He will completely part and separate us from the wicked world, the devil, death, sin, etc." (Large Catechism, Part 2: The Apostles' Creed, Article 2, 31)

Give all glory to God the Son for ascending for us, for He's to be worshiped and extolled, honored and praised for rising "high in the heavens to reign." (Hail Thee Festival Day [For Ascension]: 1) Rejoice; shout for joy that your Redeemer was taken up in order for Him to "sit at the right hand of the Father, and forever reign there and have dominion over all creatures, sanctify [us and all who] believe in Him by sending the Holy Spirit into [our] hearts to rule, comfort, and make [us] alive, and to defend [us] against the devil and the power of sin. The same Christ will openly come again to judge the living and the dead..., according to the Apostles' Creed." (Augsburg Confession, Article 3) Amen. The peace of God, which passes all understanding, keep your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus. Amen.
