### SUMMARY OF TODAY'S SCRIPTURE READINGS – THE EIGHTH SUNDAY AFTER TRINITY

Beware of False Prophets "Beware of false prophets, who come to you in sheep's clothing but inwardly are ravenous wolves." (Matthew 7:15) Deceit has its strength in masquerading as the truth. False prophets speak a vision of their own

hearts, not from the mouth of the Lord. (See Jeremiah 23:16-29) They deny the judgment of the Lord, speaking peace to the unrepentant, when in truth there is condemnation and wrath. "You will recognize them by their fruits." (Matthew 7:20) The "fruits" of a true prophet are faithfulness in proclaiming God's Word. This is the will of God the Father, that pastors take heed to the flock, the Father's adopted ones, warning them against the wolves and their lies, and shepherding God's Church which He purchased with His own blood. (See Acts 20:27-38) For the cross is that good tree bearing good fruit – namely, the body and blood of Christ, given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. (lcms.org/lectionary-summaries)

### A READING FROM THE LUTHERAN CONFESSIONS

Summary: Why does Jesus tell us to "Beware of false prophets?" These "ravenous wolves," though pious-sounding, are destructive to souls and enemies of salvation.

In addition to the Apostles' Creed, the Nicene Creed, and the Athanasian Creed, we pledge ourselves to our confession of faith. We reject all heresies and teachings that have been introduced into God's Church against it. We regard as the unanimous consensus and declaration of our Christian faith and confession – especially against the papacy and its false worship, idolatry, superstition, and against other sects – the Augsburg Confession (1530). We hold to this confession along with its Apology [Defense] (1531) and the Smalcald Articles of 1537. Such matters concern the salvation of souls. We also confess Dr. Luther's Small and Large Catechisms (1529). They are "the layman's Bible" because everything necessary for a Christian to know for salvation is included in them.

All teachings are to be conformed in this way. What is contrary to these confessions is to be rejected and condemned, as opposed to the unanimous declaration of our faith. In this way the distinction between Holy Scripture and all other writings is preserved. Scripture alone remain the judge, rule and norm. According to it, all teachings shall and must be discerned and judged to see whether they are good or evil. The other writings mentioned above are not judges like the Holy Scriptures. They are only a testimony and declaration of the Scriptures and the faith. (lemssermons.com; Epitome FC, The Summary Content, Rule and Norm)

# SERMON: AVOID FALSE TEACHERS AND THEIR BOGUS TEACHINGS; TRUST IN CHRIST AND HIS TRUE DOCTRINE ALONE – MATTHEW 7:15-23

"You will recognize them by their fruits." (Mt. 7:20) Amen.

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and Jesus Christ our Savior. Amen. "Beware of false prophets," (Mt. 7:15) your Lord Jesus says to you. In doing so, He calls upon you to be on your guard against false religious teachers. How can you tell true teachers of God and His Word from false ones? It's not as easy as you might think. Say someone quotes a verse or two from Scripture, and then goes on to say something about the texts that doesn't agree with their true, God-intended meaning. People may hear God's Word and say, "He quoted the Bible; what he said it means must be true." Yet they're at the same time being led astray because the text means one thing, while the false teacher insists it means another thing entirely.

Take John 3:3, where our Lord speaks in private with the Pharisee *Nicodemus*, who has secretly come to Jesus to find out Who He really is; what His teachings really are. Jesus tells *Nicodemus* and us: "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless a person is born again he cannot see the Kingdom of God." You've no doubt heard the term "born-again Christian." It's a popular description in American Evangelicalism of a person who's given his or her life over to Jesus. So if someone says, "You must be a born-again Christian in order to be a saved child of God," what this person means as-far-as Evangelicalism is concerned is that you must repent of your sins and turn to Christ for your salvation. That is, you must give your heart, your life, your all to Him. But is this what Jesus is actually saying in John 3:3 – what the text really means? Not in the least!

The term Jesus uses here refers to being born anew to God by being born from above, from heaven – and so being "reborn" of God by His doing alone! So nobody's ever committing his or her life to Christ one bit in being born again – at least not asfar-as He's concerned. God is committing Himself to us, taking our salvation into His own hands by "rebirthing" us to Himself in Jesus! How so? Jesus explains: "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless a person is born of water and the [Holy] Spirit, he cannot enter the Kingdom of God." (Jn. 3:5) In saying this, Christ teaches Nicodemus and us that we must be born of God, born anew to Him by-way-of "water and Spirit" or water joined with God's Word, which the Holy Spirit always works through. This language always-and-only refers to Holy Baptism in Scripture. St. Peter's divinely-inspired declaration in 1 Peter 3:21 agrees with this perfectly: "Baptism...now saves you," as do St. Paul's words in Titus 3:5: "[God] saved us, not by the righteous deeds we [have] done, but according to His mercy, through the washing of new birth and renewal of the Holy Spirit."

The language of being renewed or given new birth, new life in the Spirit through washing screams Baptism! Bottom line: A true, living, saving faith in Jesus Christ absolutely, positively comes to you by God's act of baptizing you! Being born again is never something you do for God – you offering yourself to Him, to be His. It's Him baptizing you into Christ, in Whom you're reborn forever! Since "by [God's] doing you are in Christ." (1 Cor. 1:30)

So as you can see, there's a right and a wrong way to understand John 3:3. It's not like you can accept both ways and say they're both right-teaching – not any more than you should orally receive medication tablets with motor oil. The wrong way is like GPS directing you into oncoming traffic since it lies to you about how you're to come to God as a believer and always remain in Him as a Christian. Only the true teaching of Jesus in John 3:3 and 5 comforts and assures you that He and His Spirit – through Baptism – bring you and all your fellow saints to God and make you His godly Christians forever.

Anyone who insists that you have to be born again by your own religious doing is lying to you, doing their darndest to deceive you spiritually. That person is a false teacher. Beware of him! "Mark him" (Rom. 16:17) or make careful note of him, and avoid him, as St. Paul advises you to do.

True, godly doctrine isn't as easy to sift from the false teaching of man and the devil as wheat is from chaff since false prophets, in all their cunning, stop-at-nothing to make sure their religious lies sound like Divine Truth. Using one of His excellent word-pictures, Jesus compares this to a wolf cleverly dressing himself up in the hide-and-wool of a sheep – so that to all the sheepfold, he's one of them. Just think of all the harm that he can do to them if they all think he's just another lamb! In the same way, false religious teachers are crafty and conniving, doing everything they can to fool you into believing their word as if it's God's Word, even though it's anything but. Oh, they usually won't flat-out lie to you religiously-speaking – not any more than fish will jump out of the water and into your pail if you just throw bait at them. What they'll so often do is sneakily mix religious falsehood in with Divine Truth – like drops of poison in one's favorite drink.

Several years ago, I talked with a woman going door-to-door down our street one afternoon. It was during the Lenten Season, right before Holy Week. She rang our doorbell and informed me that she and her religious group were going to observe a somber remembrance of Jesus' death in the coming days, but also a celebration of His life, and that my family and I were invited to attend the event. Her words seemed more-than-a-little-bit off to me. You see, she was describing how some people mourn and remember their recently-deceased loved ones — with a funeral and/or family get-together or what-have-you. And also how they celebrate the person's life. Yet this isn't what we're ever to do to our Lord Jesus! This woman was treating Jesus as a great man — the greatest of them all! A man deserving of love, honor and tribute. But a mere man all-the-same.

It didn't take me long to discover that this woman was a Jehovah's Witness. The thing to know about JWs is that they deny the Doctrine of the Holy Trinity and the eternal deity of the Son of God. They falsely believe that Jesus is God's highest, greatest creation. No way is He "God of God, Light of Light, very God of very God," (Nicene Creed) eternally-begotten of the Father. Normally JWs only want to "sell you" on their god, which in their case isn't God the Father or the Holy Triune God but their fake version of Him, Who isn't God at all since the JW god doesn't exist. They usually don't want to talk about Jesus since He's not God – together with the Father – to them. And yet this woman slyly sought to convince me that she and her ilk cared very much about Jesus also. But she wouldn't dare talk about Christ dying for our sins as God and man, nor about Him bodily rising from the dead since she couldn't do so. She believed neither of these wondrous truths. She didn't believe in Jesus as God and man one bit! So all she could talk about was a Jesus greater than all of us, but still only human like the rest of us. That's not Jesus at all!

The key to recognizing and avoiding false religious teachers and their lying tongues is to run their words by our Lord Jesus. Does what they say agree with what Holy Scripture declares Him to be; what Christ says about Himself? Do their words agree with what our Savior has done for us upon the cross? Being told that you must be a "born-again Christian" in the sense that it's up to you to come to saving faith in Jesus – that you have to choose God, flies-in-the-face of Sacred Scripture. "You did not choose Me, but I chose you," (In. 15:16) Jesus said to His disciples and says to you, telling you how sinners come to a true, living faith in Him. "[God] Who began a good work in you will carry it to completion until the Day of Christ Jesus." (Phil. 1:6) God Himself began His good work of faith and salvation in Jesus Christ in you – quite apart from you, your will, or any "supposed" power you have to ever come to faith in Him. And He, the Author and Finisher of your faith (see Hebrews 12:2), will see you through to His heaven by His grace and mercy in Jesus!

What does God's grace and mercy look like, sound like? You touching your forehead and saying, "I am a baptized – washed pure and saved unto God by the water and the Word of my Lord Jesus!" You hearing Jesus say to you, "Truly, truly, I say to you, whoever hears My Word and believes Him Who sent Me has eternal life. He does not come into judgment, but has passed from death to life." (In. 5:24) And you saying back to your beloved Lord: "Amen! It is so!" You eating and drinking Christ's true body and blood and trusting with all your heart that He goes into you to give you forgiveness of sins, life and salvation!

If what you hear about Jesus out there doesn't agree with what the Bible says, it ain't any good. If it disagrees with any of the following words which we Lutheran Christians confess about our Lord straight from His Word, then it's from a false prophet who only means to hurt and destroy you. For we firmly believe that "the Son of God assumed the human nature in the womb of the blessed virgin Mary...[s]o there are two natures – the divine and the human – inseparably joined in one person. There is one Christ, true God and true man, Who was born of the virgin Mary, truly suffered, was crucified, died, and was buried. He did this to reconcile the Father to us and to be a sacrifice, not only for original guilt, but also for all actual sins of mankind. He also descended into hell, and truly rose again on the third day. Afterward, He ascended into heaven to sit at the right hand of the Father. There He forever reigns and has dominion over all creatures. He sanctifies those who believe in Him, by sending the Holy Spirit into their hearts to rule, comfort, and make them alive. He defends them against the devil and the power of sin. The same Christ will openly come again to judge the living and the dead, and so forth, according to the Apostles' Creed." (Augsburg Confession, Article 3: Son of God)

If you hear anyone say that God rewards those with eternal life who choose Him, who invite Jesus into their hearts, this doesn't square at all with Biblical Truth, which is that we "are justified by [God's] grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus." (Rom. 3:24) So neither committing one's life to Christ nor working with God for one's salvation have any Biblical support, but are both to be rejected as false and deadly to the soul.

Just as grapes never grow from thorn-bushes or figs from thistle-weeds, so the Truth of Jesus Christ's Person and Work can never originate from false, man-made teaching about our Lord. Only Christ the True Vine produces Christly fruit through His Sacred Word. Just like Jesus is the Grape-vine of His dear Church, and you're His dear vine-branches attached to Him – receiving all your sap and life from Him. (See Jn. 15:1) Jesus Himself is the healthy Tree of Life which bears only good fruit – the "fruit of faith" for you, with which you're fed and nourished. The diseased tree is Satan and all his kind – demons and people – who can't bear good fruit with all their religious lies, but only rotten, nasty, poisonous fruit meant to kill. You'll know them by their fruit – whether it glorifies Jesus Christ alone as Lord and Savior...or not. For "no one can say, Jesus is Lord,' except by the Holy Spirit." (1 Cor. 12:3)

Finally, just because someone calls Jesus "Lord" doesn't automatically make the person a true Christan. Believers in Jesus always look to their heavenly Father's will for them. And what is the will of God? Jesus answers: "That you believe in Him Whom [the Father] has sent." (Jn. 6:29) People may very well prophesy in Jesus' Name, cast out demons and do mighty works in His Name – all without actually believing in the Name of Christ. So in the Final Judgment, they'll be exposed for their mere use of Jesus' Name rather than their having living faith in It. Then their fate will be sealed.

But to you and to everyone who believes in the Father and the Son.... To you and to all who are overjoyed that Jesus is Who He says He is; that He alone has done for you what He promised He'd do, this is what you'll hear from Him on the Last Day: "Come, you who are blessed by My Father, inherit the Kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world!" (Mt. 35:24) Amen. The peace of God, which passes all understanding, keep your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus. Amen.
