SUMMARY OF TODAY'S SCRIPTURE READINGS – THE TENTH SUNDAY AFTER TRINITY

Jesus Weeps for Jerusalem Our Lord wept over Jerusalem for the destruction that would soon befall her. For she did not recognize the time of God's visitation in Christ, Who had come to bring her peace. (Luke 19:41-48) Through His prophets God had consistently called His people to turn from their deceit and false worship. Yet they persisted in trusting "in deceptive words to no avail." (Jeremiah 7:8) They sought to establish their own righteousness rather than receive Christ's righteousness through faith. (Romans 9:30-10:4) So it was that God was in His temple to

cleanse it – a precursor to the once-for-all cleansing from sin which He would accomplish in the temple of His own body on the cross. God grant us to know the things that make for our peace – His visitation in the Word and Sacraments – that by the Holy Spirit we may penitently confess Jesus Christ as Lord. (lcms.org/lectionary-summaries)

A READING FROM THE LUTHERAN CONFESSIONS

Summary: Throughout Scripture, God reveals the way He has chosen to draw near to us in the person of Jesus Christ. Our Lord uses tangible means of His choosing and sending to draw us out of our sinful ideas and feelings about Him and into the very body of Christ, the Word made flesh to dwell among us.

Concerning the spoken, outward Word of God, we must firmly hold that God grants His Spirit or grace to no one, except through or with the preceding outward Word, in order that we may be protected against the enthusiast spirits who boast that they have the Spirit without the Word.

All this is the old devil and serpent, who also converted Adam and Eve into enthusiasts, and led them from the outward Word of God to spiritualizing and self-conceit. Just as also enthusiasts in our day condemn the outward Word.

In a word, enthusiasm adheres in Adam and his children from the Fall to the end of the world, its poison having been implanted and infused into them by the old dragon, and is the origin, power, and strength of all heresy, especially that of the Papacy and Mohammed (*Islam*). Therefore we ought and must constantly maintain this point, that God does not wish to deal with us otherwise than through the spoken Word and the Sacraments. It is the devil himself and none other who is extolled as Spirit without the Word and Sacraments. (*Icmssermons.com*; *Smalcald Articles*, 3/8, Confession)

APOSTLE'S CREED (CONFESSION OF FAITH) [PAGE 12]

SERMON: HOUSE OF PRAYER; HOUSE OF REPENTANCE, FAITH AND FORGIVENESS – JER. 7:1-11; LK. 19:41-48

"My house shall be a house of prayer." (Lk. 19:46) Amen.

Grace and peace to you from God our Father, and from our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Amen. Our Old and New Testament readings speak of God's temple in the holy city of Jerusalem. The word temple means a place of divine worship – a house of prayer and adoration to God, especially with an altar at its core. For the people of Israel, there was, at first, no fixed place for the worship of God. We read in the Book of Genesis how the patriarch Abraham built an altar here (see Gen. 13:18; 22: 9; 26:25), the patriarch Jacob built an altar there (see Gen. 35: 1), and also how God's servant Moses, in the Book of Exodus, built an altar to Him in the desert. From Exodus to 1 Kings, God filled a "traveling temple," known as a tabernacle, with His holy presence before all Israel. This way, wherever the Lord brought His sojourning people, His presence would go with and abide with them in the tabernacle. There, God's priests offered sacrifices of praise and thanksgiving to Him on behalf of the people – for all the goodness and mercy He'd shown them. They also offered up bloody sacrifices which atoned for or made godly restitution for all their sins.

From the beginning, the divinely-inspired authors of Holy Scripture understood God as He revealed Himself to them: as a spiritual being, without material form. In the literal sense, God doesn't have a mouth, eyes or hands. As such, He doesn't have the same limitations that we do. He can be everywhere at the same time. He doesn't need to live in a house. In fact, no earthly structure can ever contain Him like your dwelling place can contain you. Even as he built a temple for God and His people, King Solomon acknowledged: "But will God indeed dwell upon the earth? The heavens, even the highest heavens, cannot contain You, much less this temple I have built." (1 Kings 8:27)

Like God, we too are spiritual beings since He created us to be so. Yet He also fashioned us with bodies of flesh. So the prophets speak of God in terms which we can understand – that relate to us. They write of Him having a mouth by which He speaks His Word to us, a right hand which acts valiantly for us, and eyes which see everything.

Likewise, God wants His people to gather in a place of worship, instructing us to do so with the words: "Remember the Sabbath Day to keep it holy." (Ex. 20:8) God has promised to be with us everywhere, at all times. So we can pray to and worship God at home. But in order to give testimony to all the nations of the world of our common faith in Christ and the presence of God in the world.... In order for us to receive the gifts of His Word and Sacraments in communion with our fellow believers, God commands us to gather together in His Church at the appointed time.

We are the Church, the Body of Christ. The Church isn't foremost a building, but the faithful of God joined together as one in Jesus. So when someone asks, where is the Church of Christ? the answer in our *Lutheran Confessions* is wherever God's Word is publicly preached in its purity, and the Sacraments of Christ are administered in the way He has said they're to be administered. The Rev. C.F.W. Walther, who helped found our Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod, described the Church as the saints of God gathered around our Savior, Jesus.

How we need a place dedicated to the glory of God in Christ Jesus! A beautiful place where we can pray to God and adore Him; a place with images that remind us of the teachings of our Lord. For this same purpose, God commanded the people of Israel, the Old Testament Church, to build a temple. So Solomon built the first temple in Jerusalem a thousand years before the Advent of Christ. This temple was the center of the people's worship. The Israelites traveled three or four times a year to Jerusalem to offer sacrifices and praises in the temple.

Following the Babylonian conquest of Judah, Jerusalem and its temple were destroyed in divine judgment. Our Old Testament lesson describes key reasons as-to-why this happened. When the Jews returned home, they rebuilt the city and its temple. In addition, about fifty years before Jesus' birth, King Herod began a project to renovate the temple and expand it. Therefore, during Jesus' earthly ministry, the temple of Jerusalem was greater than ever.

Yet, as was the case in the days of the Prophet Jeremiah, there are alarm bells going off all over the place in Jesus' day. Our Lord weeps over Jerusalem since most of its inhabitants have ignored Him, disregarding His coming to them as the Lord their God. Christ, their true Peace with God, has come to reconcile them to their heavenly Father. It's as if He says of them, "You of all people should know from the Scriptures Who your peace with God is!" But they don't. Because they reject God's Messiah, their Savior, He hides His salvation from their eyes.

St. Matthew's account of Jesus' sorrow over Jerusalem's rejection of Him and His Father is also very heart-breaking: "O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, the city that kills the prophets and stones those who are sent to it! How often would I have gathered your children together as a hen gathers her brood under her wings, and you were not willing! See, your house is left to you desolate." (Mt. 23:37-38) Even though Jerusalemites have a dark history of spurning and murdering God's holy prophets sent to call them to repentance and faith, with a heart full of mercy, the Father still sends His own dear Son to them. "Surely they will respect My [S]on," (Mt. 21:37) He says. And they really ought to honor Him since He's the eternally-begotten, Divine Son of God! But they just don't care for Jesus any.

So like baby chicks who dash from under the cover of their mother hen, and who scatter even further away the more she seeks them out, those in Israel and everywhere who reject the Lord's life and His shielding protection will be devoured and destroyed apart from Him. Both Matthew and Luke describe the coming annihilation of Jersualem and its temple, and the slaughter of its inhabitants as a "final judgment" on unbelieving Israel in that era. And as a stern warning to the people of God in times-to-come.

Jesus' Jerusalem mirrors Jeremiah's Jerusalem as they both blatantly refuse to "hear [and heed] the Word of the Lord." (Jer. 7:2) Even though God – through His prophet and His own Son – calls upon the populace to "amend [their] ways and [their] deeds," (Jer. 7:3) they have no intention of doing so. They won't back down from their evils. They don't care to do what's right: to act justly toward one another; to treat foreigners, orphans and widows well. They refuse to believe God's Word; to do what it says, so that they steal from each other, murder one another, commit adultery, swear falsely to each other and worship false gods like Baal – all-the-while claiming to be faithful and devoted to the Lord. They're like a child who's been playing in a mud-hole, is filthy-dirty, and then claims to his mom that a quick, passing rain shower has washed him off completely, only for it to have done nothing to clean him. Only their evil hearts, evil deeds and idolatry are real. Their repentance toward God is a farce, their worship of Him is totally fake, and their belief that God honors them even though they keep on doing evil stuff is beyond ridiculous!

The Babylonians eviscerated Jeremiah's Jerusalem in 587 BC. And Roman legions pulverized Jesus' Jerusalem to rubble and dust in AD 70. Both temples were burned to ash, the second one forever. This ought to give us pause, since we too are sinners who deserve for this to happen to us. All that separates us from 6th-century BC Jerusalem and 1st-century AD Jerusalem is our true repentance before God and our faith in Jesus. Like Jerusalemites of the past, we've done many, grave things which dishonor God and spite others. So we dare not ever turn our true repentance into false, show-repentance, where we only tear our clothes in bogus contrition, and not our hearts in genuine sorrow. (See Joel 2:13) Where we exchange our trust in Christ for a false confidence in Him – one where He's really not the atoning Sacrifice for our sins, the Pardoner of our iniquities…because we don't think we really need Him to be this for us.

It's a blessing for us to have this sanctuary as a house of prayer. We know that God doesn't need a house. Nor does He need to hear our prayers. Yet He desires to "come to us [and] abide with us" (TLH 647:4) and to hear us call upon Him. We don't need to offer sacrifices for the taking away of our sins. Even sacrifices in the temple of Jerusalem only pointed to the perfect sacrifice of Christ upon the cross for us. Because of His blood shed for us there, Jesus has paid the price of our sins forever. Christ's true flesh and His real, sacred blood were given to us in

Bethlehem and outside Jerusalem at Calvary – for the forgiveness of our sins and also for the nourishment of our faith.

So beware of merely drawing near to God with your lips, while your heart is far from Him. (See Is. 29:13) See to it that you don't refuse to take your sin-guilt seriously, since you don't want to also refuse to take God's forgiveness for you in Jesus seriously. Never tire of His Church for you so that you fall away from Him. For how shall we escape God's wrath if we neglect such a great salvation? (See Heb. 2:3) Instead, always remain in Christ, and He in you! (See Jn. 15:4) Abide in Him always in His Church and yours!

In our Church, we keep the religious rites of the ancient Church to show our solidarity with the Church everywhere and of all times, because the Church of Christ isn't just in one place or only in one era. But it's not worth it if we don't live our faith outside of this holy sanctuary. It's no good if we don't live in the joy of our salvation in Christ Jesus everywhere, in all situations. So always do so, saints of God! Live out your faith in Jesus, active in love and good words toward God and one another – not by your own strength, but by the power of the Holy Spirit Whom you've received in Holy Baptism. For it is He "Who works in you both to will and to work according to His good pleasure." (Phil. 2:13) "He has shown you...what is good. And what does the Lord require of you but to act justly, to love mercy, and to walk humbly with your God?" (Micah 6:8) So do so fervently, clothed – as you are – in Christ's righteousness.

We begin our week together in this holy house of worship and praise, adoring our Savior and giving public testimony of our most holy faith in Him. During the week-to-come, in our homes and families, we also give testimony. Because Christ is with us everywhere, forever. Amen. The peace of God, which passes all understanding, keep your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus. Amen.

Bless Donald, our president; Greg, our governor; the United States Congress and the Texas legislature, and all those who make and administer our laws. Bless all judges, that they might make decisions with wisdom and for the preservation of justice. Bless those in law enforcement, that they might serve and protect their communities in safety of both body and mind. Defend all in our military personnel, and give courage to both them and their families. Lord, in Your mercy, **C: hear our prayer.**

Protect Your Church from the love of money and worldly power, that our focus would always be on the proclamation of Your life-giving Word and the administration of Your blessed Sacraments, so that many would be brought by the Holy Spirit to faith. Lord, in Your mercy, **C: hear our prayer.**

In Your mercy protect all life, whether young or old. Prohibit the use of abortion and euthanasia to end lives You have created in Your image. Provide good, right and salutary means to protect and save the lives of the unborn and to bring comfort and dignity to the aging. Lord, in Your mercy, **C: hear our prayer.**

Support and strengthen those who are suffering, those recovering from surgery, injury or illness, including ______. In the midst of their affliction, focus them always upon Christ and everlasting hope, and if it is Your will, restore those for whom we pray to physical health and strength. Lord, in Your mercy, **C: hear our prayer.**

Give Your divine increase to the fruits of the land, turn away harmful storms, drought, famine, scarcity, war, danger from fires and floods, and other maladies. Stay with us, O faithful Father, until our end, and never let Your Spirit leave us, so that we may live in Your fear, die in Your grace, and finally receive the goal of our faith, our soul's salvation. Lord, in Your mercy, **C:** hear our prayer.

As You have invited, and as Your Son has taught, we have brought our prayers unto You, heavenly Father. Receive them not on the basis of our merit, but in the Name of Jesus, our Great High Priest, Who with You and the Holy Spirit is our one God, now and forever. **C: Amen.**
